 - Bachelor thesis (30 to 50 Pages excl. Abstract, Content Page, Cover Sheet, and Appendix)
 - Master thesis (50 to 80 Pages excl. Abstract, Content Page, Cover Sheet, and Appendix)
- Preparation in accordance with the guidelines of the department (see ISE-Homepage)
 - Please use the provided formatting template (Word or Latex)
 - Literature can be managed using tools such as Endnote, Citavi or Zotero (the last two programs are licensed at TU Darmstadt)
- Grading of the thesis
 - The written thesis contributes 100% to the final grade
